- Nationwide environmental education event began in Pennsylvania in 1979
- Began in Minnesota in 1993
- Unique, hands-on outdoor competition for high school students
- Challenges students' environmental knowledge and problem solving skills
- Teams visit five 25-minute learning stations based on key areas of the environment
- Stations presented by natural resource professionals in the fields of wetlands, wildlife, forestry, soils and a current environmental issue
- Students make a 10-minute oral presentation on current issue topic (Sr. teams only)
- Top three teams from Area 2 advance to state competition
- Winner of Minnesota's competition advances to the National Envirothon
